The liturgy in which we celebrate the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Bread that is made without yeast so that it doesn't rise.

The change of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, which occurs when the priest says the Words of Consecration, "This is my Body," and "This is my Blood."

The bread from heaven that God gave to the Israelites in the desert

An ornate box-like container where the Eucharist is reserved for prayer and adoration outside of Mass. Jesus is present in the Tabernacle.

The forgiveness of our sins and healing of our friendship with God so that we can be with him in Heaven.

A serious sin that separates us from God and results in the loss of Sanctifying Grace.

The Liturgy, which is comprised of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The rule that we must not eat or drink anything (except for water or medicine) for at least one hour before receiving Holy Communion.

Another name for Sunday, because the Lord rose from the dead on a Sunday. We must always go to Mass on Sundays unless there is a serious reason.
